Stryzewski named Advisor of the Year for the National Social Security Association

Between the two firms, they serve over 2,000 active clients. Sound Planning Group was named the "Best of Kirkland" in 2015 and 2016 for insurance and financial services. The firm has 2,000 clients.

"Many couples we serve will receive more than \$1 million in joint income from their Social Security benefits alone," he said. "As a full-service advisor with a fiduciary obligation to serve my clients best interests, I believe providing Social Security education and recommendations is essential to building a coordinated retirement plan."

The National Social Security Association has awarded certificates to more than 1,000 advisors nationwide since 2013. Premier offered NSSA Social Security classes to financial advisors, CPAs,
